Day of Mourning, April 28th, 2009

Every year, more than 1,000 Canadian workers are killed on the job.

Thousands more are permanently disabled.

Hundreds of thousands are injured.

Thousands of others die from cancer, lung disease, and other ailments caused by exposure to substances at their workplaces.

**April 28th of each year has been chosen by the
Canadian Labour Congress as:**

*A Day of Mourning for these victims of workplace
accidents and disease;*

*A day to remember the maximum sacrifice they have
made to earn a living;*

*A day to renew approaches to governments for tougher
occupational health and safety standards, and
more effective compensation;*

*A day to rededicate ourselves to the goal of making
Canada's workplaces safer.*

**April 28th is hereby proclaimed as an annual Day of Mourning in
recognition of workers killed, injured or disabled on the job.**
